

ABOUT THE GRAND PRIX

The FIABCI-USA Grand Prix of Real Estate is an annual competition that recognizes American real estate projects embodying excellence in the many disciplines involved in their creation. This prestigious award is an affirmation of the FIABCI ideal of providing society with optimal solutions to its property needs, inclusively making for better places to live, work, and play.

Through this competition, the USA Chapter of FIABCI seeks out the most impactful and/or influential real estate projects across the country. A panel of expert judges rates each project on specific criteria, and those achieving exemplary status are recognized with an award, regardless of the number of entries received in a category.

This year's award recipients are now eligible and invited to advance on to an international round of competition, the 2022 FIABCI World Prix d'Excellence. Those who accept the invitation will compete with counterparts from other FIABCI chapters around the world. The due date to register for the Prix d'Excellence is December 31, 2021, with its awards ceremony scheduled to take place next June in Paris, France.





Located on the 'Iolani School campus, in the heart of Honolulu, Residence Hall is home to 112 students in Grades 9 to 12. The dorm units are arranged around an alcove, promoting interactions between students, while also capturing panoramic views of Diamond Head and Waikiki. In order to save a large, 65-year-old monkeypod tree, the building's footprint was designed in an "L" shape, subsequently creating a courtyard for all students to enjoy.

Constructed in 1916, Elks Temple served as the primary place for the Elks, a fraternal club, to gather in Tacoma until 1966. After several changes of ownership and suffering almost 40 years of abandonment and neglect, the property was acquired and restored by McMenamins. It reopened in 2019 as an entertainment hub that features 45 hotel rooms, three restaurants, five bars, a concert venue, and flexible event space.






